Please allow me to provide an update on the ongoing treatment of the above captioned patient with regards to her oral health care.

Ms. Plante initially attended my office on Jan XX, 20XX with a chief complaint of discomfort and soreness of her edentulous maxillary arch in the denture bearing areas. Clinical examination revealed an ill-fitting complete upper denture complicated by denture stomatitis. An oral swab revealed the presence of Candida Albicans.

Antifungal therapy, Nystatin oral rinses, qid for 14 days has been initiated. A treatment plan has been developed to address the ill-fitting denture which may include relining or refabrication of the complete upper denture.

Education resources were provided to guide on denture cleaning using mild solutions, demonstrating proper denture hygiene techniques, and emphasizing the importance of regular denture care to prevent the recurrence of stomatitis. Regular follow-up appointments are necessary post-reline to assess the new denture fit, monitor oral hygiene, and observe signs of stomatitis resolution. Ongoing check-ups were planned to manage oral health. Her diabetes requires careful consideration due to an increased susceptibility to infections.
